NATIONAL NIGHT OUT

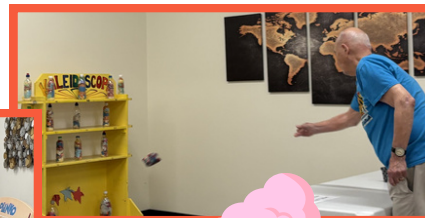
National Night Out takes place every August and brings neighbors and local police together. The goal is to strengthen community ties and make neighborhoods safer.

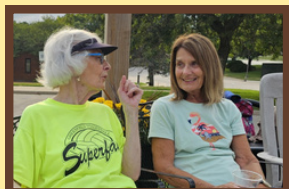


FLOATS AND FRIENDSHIP

September 12, 2026, will be a very special day throughout the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. Eleven men, accompanied by their wives and families, will be welcomed into the permanent diaconate during a solemn ordination ceremony. Among them will be Pastoral Care Director, Tom Brefka, who will be ordained a permanent deacon. These eleven men come from communities throughout the Archdiocese—from as far south as Kenosha, as far north as Sheboygan, as far west as Oconomowoc, and from communities throughout the Milwaukee metropolitan area. Each has responded to God's call to serve the Church and God's people in a special way.

The ministry of a deacon is centered on three important pillars of service: Word, Liturgy, and Charity. As ministers of the Word, deacons proclaim the Gospel and help others grow in their understanding and love of the Catholic faith. As ministers of the Liturgy, they assist at Mass, proclaim the Gospel, preach, and help lead the Church in prayer and worship. As ministers of Charity, they bring Christ's love and compassion to those in need, serving people both within and beyond the walls of the Church.

Please keep these eleven men, their wives, and their families in your prayers as they begin this new chapter of ministry and service. We are especially grateful and excited to welcome the ministry of a deacon to our Clement Manor community.

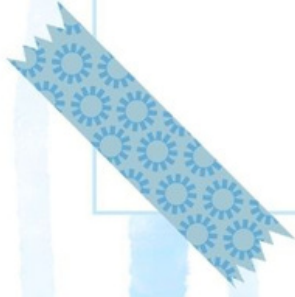

DEPARTURE CEREMONY

At Clement Manor, every resident's life is honored and remembered. A Departure Ceremony is offered to recognize and celebrate a resident's life, provide a moment of reflection, and accompany the resident on their final journey with dignity, compassion, and respect.

What is a Departure Ceremony?

- A brief religious ceremony held following a resident's passing
- A commemorative quilt, made by the Franciscan Sisters of Christian Charity, is placed over the resident
- Prayers and spiritual reflection are offered in honor of the resident
- Staff, family, and loved ones may accompany the resident as they leave the unit
- A respectful farewell that honors the resident with dignity, compassion, and reverence

Why Is a Departure Ceremony Important?

- Honors each resident's life and legacy
- Reflects our commitment to dignity and respect
- Provides comfort and closure for families and staff
- Creates a meaningful moment of reflection

When Are Departure Ceremonies Held?

- Departure Ceremonies are typically conducted Monday through Friday between 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. During these hours, we are able to gather an appropriate number of staff members to participate in a meaningful and respectful ceremony.
- While we strive to provide a Departure Ceremony for every resident, a formal ceremony may not always be possible outside of these hours. Regardless of the time of passing, every resident will continue to be treated with dignity, compassion, and respect.

Respecting Your Wishes

- If you or your loved one does not wish to have a Departure Ceremony, please notify a member of the care team, social worker, or nurse at any time. Your wishes will be honored and respected.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

- **Companion Visits:** Spend one on one time with residents through conversation, games, taking walks, or reading.
- **Activity Assistance:** Help with arts & crafts, escorting residents to and from in-house activities, escorting residents on outings, and assist with special events such as holiday celebrations, live music performances by local artists and community gatherings.
- **Pet Pals:** Regular scheduled visits with a qualified animal companion, to bring therapeutic benefits, joy and comfort to individuals who may be experiencing loneliness or illness.
- **Office Support:** Assist with putting together folders and packets for new hires, marketing materials, and more.
- **Spiritual Support:** Assist our Pastoral Care team with escorting residents to and from mass, assist with fellowship service, and more.
- **Salon & Spa:** Escort residents to and from beauty shop appointments, and provide customer service to residents
- **Instructor:** Share your talent, skill or area of interest with others in a group of lifelong learners in our Center for Enrichment. We are looking for presenters in all disciplines, but especially those who can teach art, music, current affairs, history, political science, economics, and foreign languages.
